Since 2006, New Life Furniture Bank (NLFB) has served as Southwest Ohio's only furniture bank. The mission is simple – **to provide gently used furniture to people in need.** The hope is to give "new life" to empty homes by providing furniture to those overcoming homelessness, extreme poverty, or other devastating circumstances.

Our Vision

Our vision is to help end the cycle of homelessness and poverty in our region by providing essential home

furnishings to those in need. We are part of a holistic network of organizations in our region that are working together to provide supportive services to those starting over. At NLFB, we believe in the **healing power of both giving and receiving** to restore dignity, pride in ownership, and hope for a better future.

FROM THE CEO & PRESIDENT, DANA SAXTON

As I reflect on the past year, I am filled with immense gratitude for what we accomplished together in 2024. It was a remarkable year, made possible by the passion, commitment, and dedication of our staff, volunteers, and a community whose support never wavered. Because of you, our impact was extraordinary:

- Distributed 33,700 pieces of furniture and household items and furnished 2,399 homes!
- Served **5,811 neighbors** in need with over half being children.
- Provided **2,035 beds** to ensure no one has to sleep on the floor.
- Built 2,594 pieces of furniture in our woodshop.
- Engaged 2,733 volunteers who gave 20,927 hours of service.

The New Life Furniture Thrift Store continues to play a vital role in advancing our mission — raising community awareness, increasing furniture donations, and providing a sustainable source of earned income. In 2024, our incredible retail team processed, sorted, priced, and placed an astounding **241,211 items** on the sales floor, generating **\$937,044** in revenue.

Every week, we furnished more than **45 homes**. Our **16 warehouse** associates lifted and moved over **1,000 tons of furniture**, collecting donations and delivering comfort, dignity, and hope to neighbors rebuilding their lives.

Our vision is bold — to help end the cycle of homelessness. Our mission is clear — and it is our greatest strength. In 2024, we remained laser-focused on expanding our capacity, serving as many individuals and families as possible, and making a lasting impact in our community.

Thank you for being an essential part of this incredible journey. We look forward to continuing this life-changing work together in the year ahead.

Volunteers sort and pack household items, build furniture, and help deliver items to make a house a home for neighbors in need.




Over 70 agencies providing supportive services directly to those in need refer individuals and families for furniture.

CHANGING LIVES

A CLOSER LOOK: LAYLA'S STORY

Layla is the primary caregiver for her granddaughter and had recently started over in a newly renovated apartment. While it offered a fresh start, she didn't have the means to furnish it. With only an air mattress to sleep on, Layla struggled to create a comfortable home for her and her granddaughter.

That changed when she was referred to New Life Furniture Bank. Layla now has a safe, warm, and welcoming space—not only for her granddaughter but for the rest of her family as well.

"If it weren't for New Life Furniture Bank," Layla shared, "it would've taken me at least two years to furnish my home the way they did."

Now, Layla can focus on her job, support her granddaughter with confidence, and even host her other grandkids for dinner—something she couldn't do before. With a fully furnished home, she no longer feels isolated. She feels connected, hopeful, and empowered.

"If it weren't for New Life Furniture Bank," Layla shared, "it would've taken me at least two years to furnish my home the way they did."



New Life Furniture Bank is proud to partner with the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency to advance a shared mission: protecting the environment through reduce, reuse, and recycle initiatives while strengthening our community.

Thanks to Recycle Ohio grants, New Life Furniture Bank expanded its capacity to collect, recycle, and redistribute furniture throughout Southwest Ohio—turning empty houses into homes and giving new life to materials that might otherwise end up in landfills.

- A new box truck and electric van now power our daily furniture collection and recycling operations—helping us reach more families in need while reducing our carbon footprint.
- Our Don't Trash. Donate. outreach campaign is inspiring hundreds of Southwest Ohio residents to see their gently used furniture not as waste, but as an opportunity to change lives.

This partnership is making a measurable impact:

- In 2024, our recycling efforts generated \$5,003 in revenue—a 212% increase from 2023.
- Our team delivered **125 carloads of scrap metal** (over 21,000 pounds) to Cohen Recycling, turning discarded materials into funding that supports families in crisis.

Together, New Life Furniture Bank and the Ohio EPA are proving that sustainability and



social impact go hand in hand. Every piece saved from a landfill, every mile traveled by our new fleet, and every donation inspired by this campaign brings us closer to a healthier, more compassionate community.
